The Wirraway

Named after the legendary WWII Aussie training aircraft, the Wirraway is an outstanding example of the Aussie motorhome craft. They don't build any, but what they lack in quantity they make up for in quality.

The Wirraway is built on the Mercedes Benz 413 CDI Sprinter, a reli-

able and easy to drive unit. The exterior is all class, from the light, strong body to the two-pack epoxy paintwork.

Built in solid Tasmanian myrtle, the kitchen is a delight – classy yet practical. The dinette is mounted behind the driver's seat and both forward seats swivel to suit. A rear island bed stars in an outstanding bedroom at the rear, with plenty of room and storage.

The Wirraway's bathroom is surprisingly big for a small-ish motorhome, with a separate glass-door shower, loads of storage, mirrored shaving cabinet, hand basin and loo.

Throughout the Wirraway, the quality of fixtures and fittings is first class. It may not be as quick as its name-sake, but why go fast when you can travel in style? ■
